- G) Require a review of the City's Master Plan every ten (10) years.
- H) Appointments to committees shall be made by the Mayor and approved by City Council.
- I) After passage, publication of ordinances and resolutions shall be done in a newspaper as well as on the City's website.
- J) The powers and duties of the Board of Zoning Appeals shall be set by City Council.
- K) Consistent with Ohio law, the City Manager is not required to live in the City.
- L) City Council shall have the power to define by ordinance the role of executive sessions.
- M) Removed the requirement that the City's Planning and Zoning Commission meet every month.
- N) Adopted the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code as it relates to write-in candidates and election watchers and challengers.
- O) Requires a Charter Review Commission be appointed by City Council every ten (10) years to review the document.

If the Revised Charter is approved by a majority of those electors voting at the general election, Tuesday, November 5, 2019, the Revised Charter will take effect after certification of the election results.
